Nauru pays tribute to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

Queen Elizabeth II, the UK's longest-serving monarch died at her Scottish estate Balmoral aged 96, after reigning for 70 years.

The Government and people of the Republic of Nauru are deeply saddened by the news of Her Majesty's passing and extended heartfelt condolences to the Royal family and the people of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

The Nauru flag flew at half-mast outside the Government Offices on 9 September. His Excellency President Lionel Aingimea declared Monday 12 September a special public holiday as 'Remembrance Day' in honour of Her Majesty.

According to the BBC, Her Majesty died peacefully on the afternoon of Thursday 8 September at her Scottish estate, where she had spent much of the summer.

Prince Charles was officially proclaimed King on the Saturday following the Queen's death at Saint James's Palace in London.

In a letter to the UK Prime Minister, the Rt Honourable Elizabeth Truss, President Aingimea said Her Majesty the Queen lived her life of dedication to duty and service to her people, the Crown and the family of the Commonwealth countries.

In October 1982, Queen Elizabeth II visited Nauru with Prince Philip on the Royal Yacht Britannia during the presidency of the late Hammer DeRoburt. She remains the only British monarch or royalty to have visited Nauru. The Pacific tour that year included Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Kiribati, Tuvalu and Fiji.

An extract from the Nauru Philatelic Bureau publication, Kaleidoscope of Nauru 1983, the late President DeRoburt said in his opening address welcoming the Queen to Nauru, "Your most gracious Majesty, this visit gives all of us here the greatest pleasure and on behalf of the people of Nauru, I welcome Your Majesty and His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh in the warmest manner.

"This is the first visit made to Nauru by Royalty from the United

Kingdom, and Your Majesty does us a great honour in coming here so that we can meet in person."

In 1968 Nauru became the first Pacific Island nation, and the 29th country globally to join the Commonwealth, as a special member; and later as a full member in 1999.

The Queen was born Elizabeth Alexandra Mary Windsor, in Mayfair, London, on 21 April 1926.

Her father became King George VI and, at age 10, she became heir to the throne.

Her children are King Charles III, Princess Anne, Prince Andrew and Prince Edward. There are a total of eight grandchildren and twelve great grandchildren.

At the age of 27, she was crowned at Westminster Abbey on 2 June 1953, in front of a then-record TV audience estimated at more than 20 million people.

Her reign spanned 15 prime ministers starting with Winston Churchill, born in 1874, and including Ms Liz Truss, born 101 years later in 1975 – whose appointment broke tradition by being formally appointed at Balmoral rather than at Buckingham Palace, due to concerns about the Queen's health.

In June 2022 Britain celebrated Queen Elizabeth's 70 years on the throne with the 'Platinum Jubilee', a four-day national holiday to honour the queen's reign.

On the day of her passing, the official notice posted outside Buckingham Palace read: "The Queen died peacefully at Balmoral this afternoon. The King and Queen Consort will remain at Balmoral this evening and will return to London tomorrow."

The royal family's official website announced that the Queen was laid to rest alongside her late husband, Prince Philip Duke of Edinburgh at the King George VI memorial chapel at Windsor Castle •

Our thoughts and prayers are with you all. The Lord said in the gospel of John 11:25 ".... I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die."
